Some of the donated books we receive have recent publication dates and are in excellent condition. These books are posted on Amazon for sale at a higher price than we charge at our book sales.

Since July 1, 2024, to present we have sold 43 books online for a total of \$1,791 which is an average of \$41.65 per book.

FRIENDS CHOICE AWARDS

On Oct 9, 2024, the Friends Choice awards for 2024 were held at the Chantilly Regional Public Library. The Friends Choice Award was established by the Library Board of Trustees in 2008 and honors the hard work, dedication and continued service of members of the various library Friends groups. Recipients are selected by their peers.

Of the twenty-nine Friends that were selected from all library branches in Fairfax County, two were from our Centreville Regional Library: **Tara Lassiter and Rhonda Savage**.



Tara is a charter member of our Friends organization. She serves as Vice President as well as filling in the role of Secretary and most recently, as Treasurer. Tara has willingly stepped up and assisted whenever there has been a need and is an invaluable asset to our organization.

Rhonda provides critical skills to the Friends in graphic design, newsletter creation and is on the Centreville Friends board as Secretary. She has willingly offered her many talents and dedication to our organization.

Did You Know?



FAIRFAX COUNTY PUBLIC LIBRARY (FCPL) statistics for 2024 (July 1, 2023 thru July 30, 2024) were recently published in the FCPL annual report).

Did you know that FCPL is one of only 37 library systems in the world to achieve 3 million digital checkouts in a single year! You might also be amazed at some of these additional statistics:

- ◆ Total FY2024 circulation came to 11,966,801 (a 6.6% increase over the year before)
- ◆ 3,671,894 e-books were circulated a whopping 22.4% increase over 2023!
 Print book circulation came to 8,294,907 a 0.9% increase from the previous year.
- ◆ Total WiFi connections came to 317,459 and total public computer sessions were 223,407 – 11.7% over 2023.
- Total website visits were 1,505,505 and total database usage was 2,435,450 for a total of 3,216,857 visits (including curbside services), a 13.6% increase over 2023.
- ♦ 62,712 residents opened up new library accounts 5.5% increase for a total average of 646,723 cardholders which is an 11.9% increase from the previous year! (Our county population is a bit over 1.1M residents).
- ◆ The average monthly LEAP cards used were 199,948. LEAP stands for Library Equity Access Pass and is available to all Fairfax County Public School students (K-12). This pass allows students to check out library books without a library card by just using their name.
- ◆ Total program attendance at all events came to 263,074, an increase of 21% from 2023.
- ◆ Library volunteers (including our Centreville Friends Group) contributed 72,299 hours an increase of 1.2%.



Children's Summer Reading Festival a Resounding Success!

On August 18, 2024, Fairfax County Public Library (FCPL) and the Fairfax Library Foundation (FLF) sponsored a Children's Summer Reading Festival at Chantilly Regional Library, our sister Sully District library.

For the second year, Centreville Friends contributed to this event as a \$2,500 sponsoring organization! Your volunteer work with our book sales allowed this to happen.

This event celebrates FCPL's Summer Reading Adventure and approximately 2,700 people attended.

Attendees enjoyed face painting, a balloon artist, caricature artists, educational displays, a moon bounce, popcorn, candy, crafts, etc. Chantilly Friends gave out free children's books. Much joy and opportunity for learning was had by the participants.
